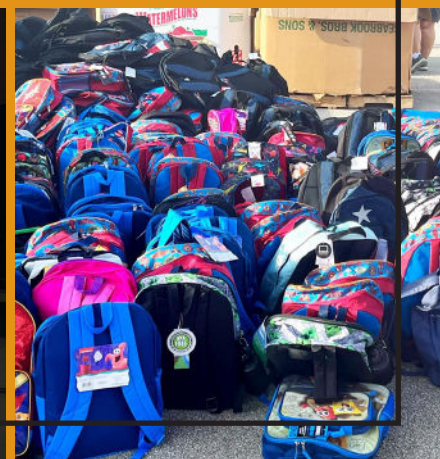
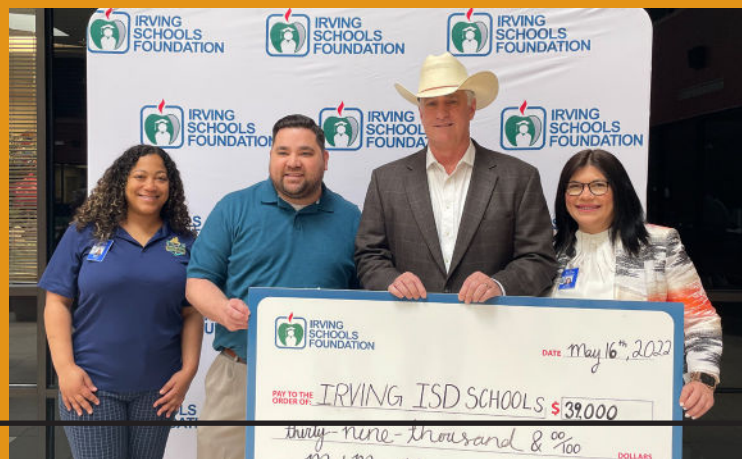

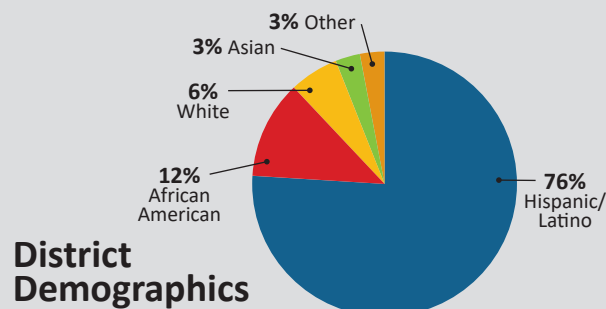

This year, we celebrated the accomplishments of Irving ISD seniors with scholarship awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$30,000.

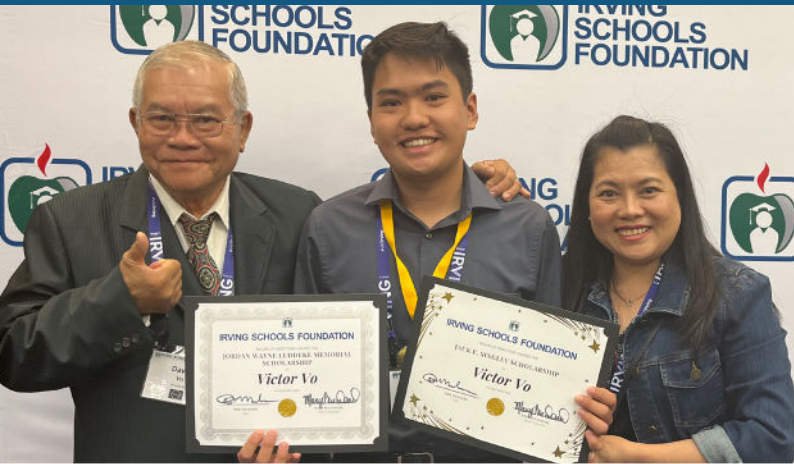
